Marriage: Minimum **Six months** noticed required. Couples must be practising members of our Parish. Call the Parish Office to arrange a meeting with the priest.

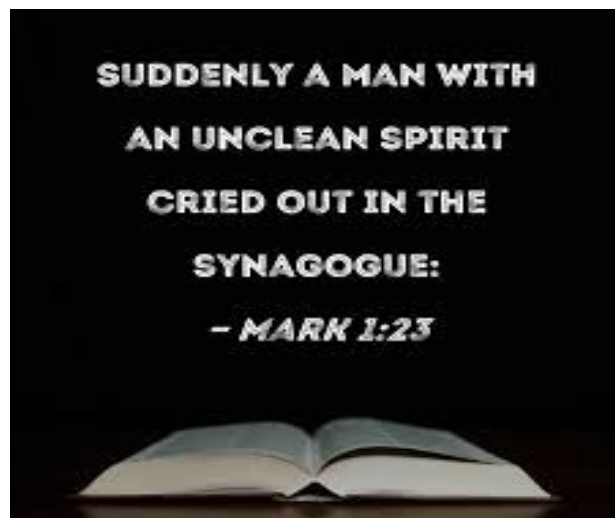
Ministry of Presence (The St. Luke Society) If you or someone you know is unable to attend Mass and would like to receive Holy Communion, please contact the parish office.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church

What does the Catechism have to say about the *“Our Father”*. As we break it down, we will include what *Fr. Mike Schmitz* has to say about each section of the Our Father as he spoke about it in the *“Catechism in a Year”* podcast. In this page we will give the readings in the Catechism which you can read on your own, either online or from the book. FYI, our parish has a few copies of the Catechism of the Catholic Church in the library in the boardroom, so please feel free to borrow a copy for this purpose. If you would like to listen to the episode on the podcast where Fr. Mike speaks even more on the Our Father, listen to episodes #359-361. Paragraphs 2803-2827. **The next section deals with the seven petitions.** As we will shift our focus in the bulletin just before Lent begins, there is too much to get into from the podcast, so snippets will be printed here over the next two weeks. Please take the time to listen to the episodes for yourself, to get the full picture of what Fr. Mike is conveying to us about the beautiful prayer that Jesus gave us, The Our Father.

Verse three is for his own sake. *God may your name be hallowed* (may your name be holy, may your name be known, may your name be loved). In Jesus the name of the Holy God is revealed and given to us in the flesh as Saviour, revealed by what He is by His word and by His sacrifice. Remember this whole connection. That God’s name and his works are inextricably connected. And so then the holy name of God in Jesus is fully revealed and fully given to us in the flesh as Saviour, revealed by what he is, by his word and by his sacrifice, by what he said and by what he did. As Christians we’re meant to reveal the name of Jesus, reveal the name of God, the name above every other name by what we say and by what we do. A lot to shoot for, but we’re made for this, made for more. St. Cyprian says, ‘We ask for this daily, for we need sanctification daily so that we who fail daily may cleanse away our sins by being sanctified continually because we sin daily.’ God’s name is blessed when we live well, but it’s blasphemed when we live wickedly. So we ask that just as the name of God is holy, so we may obtain His Holiness in our souls.

May thy Kingdom come, they will be done. His Kingdom comes, his will is done, is a reorientation of our hearts. He puts into our mouths these words that reveal first thing first. And the first thing here is the one whom we love, that his name is hallowed, that his Kingdom comes, that his will is done. It’s so much love. The Kingdom of God has been coming since the Last Supper, and in the Eucharist it is in our midst. Now, in the Holy Mass. In the Eucharist, the Kingdom, as a church, gathers around the altar to worship God the Father. That kingdom is in our midst when we worship God in spirit and the truth in the Eucharist, and our Lord Jesus Christ reigns. Father in heaven reigns when we celebrate the Eucharist. The Eucharist is so much more than a worship service. It’s more than a gathering just to pray. But in the Eucharist, in the Mass alone, the Kingdom is in our midst. The Kingdom of God comes to us on earth, and particularly present in the Eucharist... When we pray, ‘Thy kingdom come we are also praying for the final coming of the reign of God through Christ’s return; we’re praying for the end of the world. It doesn’t distract us from our mission today, it’s meant to inflame in our hearts a greater desire to actually work to bring about Christ’s reign, the reign of God to be more present in this world, through our prayer and through our taking care of the poor. God is glorified when that happens, when we give up ourselves for others, God is glorified. When that happens, His Kingdom is even more present. **So we ask our Father to unite our will to his sons in order to fulfill his will. His plan of salvation for the life of the world...**

Thy will be done. CS Lewis said, there are only two kinds of people in the end. Those who say to God, thy will be done, and those to whom God says in the end, thy will be done. This has to be our prayer, because our natural inclination is to say MY will be done, right?! And yet, here is this prayer that Jesus gives us and says Ok, every time you pray, every time you come to the Father, train your heart right to be able to say no Father, THY will be done. In Christ and through his human will, the will of the Father has been perfectly fulfilled once for all. So we ask our Father to unite our will with the sons in order to fulfill His will, his plan of salvation for life of the world. And this is tough! We are incapable of this. But united with Jesus and with the power of His Spirit, we can surrender our will to Him and decide to choose what his Son has already chosen to do, what is pleasing to the Father. God’s grace united with Jesus and the power of His Holy Spirit, we can surrender our will to him.... There is so much more, listen to the podcast! Next week:

But the second series of petitions, the last four, we’re praying for ourselves in many ways. Give us this day Our Daily Bread and forgive us our trespasses...These petitions concern our life as such to be fed and healed of sin. And the last two, lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil concern our battle for the victory of life, the battle, that battle of prayer. There’s something remarkable about this that it keeps this right before our eyes. Yes we have today’s business. We need God here, right here, right now. We need him immediately and also raises our eyes to the ultimate end. The ultimate end is God. There’s a battle that we’re all in. Lead us not into temptation and deliver us from evil. It’s so important to keep these things in the forefront of our minds

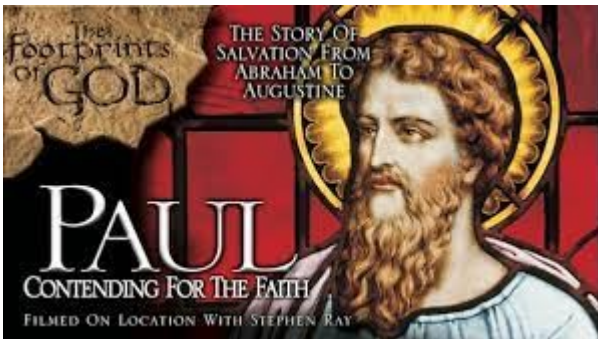
