- Support the vocation of marriage and family as a domestic church

- Youth involvement in parish life and leadership

3. Reaching out to others, especially those in need, and those on the peripheries.

- Create welcoming, listening, parish communities
- Assist and advocate for the most vulnerable
- Discern social and environmental issues

Please consider prayerfully the following questions:

1. What do you appreciate most about St. Viator's parish, especially those things that help you grow in your faith and as a disciple of the Lord?
2. Considering the three Overarching Themes of the Synod (as outlined above), which speaks to you as being the most important at this time? Are there other pastoral challenges for our parish?
3. Which of the priorities listed under each Overarching Themes seems the best way for us to begin to respond?

A stewardship virtue that is enhanced by gratitude is *simplicity*. One of the joys of simplicity is that it gives us the freedom from being caught up in the excessive, and unnecessary, debt that plagues so many today. 3. Be on guard to catch yourself before complaining and look for something to be grateful for ...we are all blessed in so many ways it will not be hard to find something to be grateful for.
