## A Heart of Discussion

### God's Love is Endless

*When we think of how endless God's love is, is there anything that would stop God from loving us?*

*Nothing ever stops God from loving us. God loves us so much that he gave his only Son, Jesus, so that we could live with God forever. What an amazing act of love!*

*God's love does not stop there. Each of us is loved by God and held as a special treasure in God's hands.*

*We may at times not appreciate God's love in our life,*

*but God's love always remains.*

*Jesus helps us understand just how endless God's love is in the Parable of the Prodigal Son, (Lk 15:11-32). The parable teaches us that we sometimes make poor choices and neglect to see the consequences of our actions. However, we are always able to experience God's love if we make the choice to change. For just as the Father welcomed back his wayward son, God always welcomes us back to his loving heart.*

*As the Lenten Season continues, let us consider how we are returning to God's love.*

### A Heart of Action

To change our hearts, we need to change our actions. This week consider one of the following tasks:

1. Change in the world begins with us. Help out a community organization this week.
2. God's love is something we must share. Where in your community can you bring God's love?
3. Say a kind word to a person at school/work who appears to be having a bad day.

## Children and Baptism

Rituals we take for granted may not always be completely understood by children. If we assume that they understand these rituals, we might not take the time to explain what we do and why.



From the earliest times, Lent has been a time of preparation for *baptism*. Eventually, it also became time for renewal of the already baptized. We must integrate the baptismal character of Lent into our daily lives.

In preparation for the renewal of baptismal promises during the Easter season, children can research their own baptism: date, place, godparents, promises made, etc. This information can be put on a collage, in a booklet, or a drawing and displayed where it will be a reminder to the children to live out their baptism every day. Also discuss with children how they are living their baptismal promises.

Emphasizing the baptismal character of Lent will have three benefits for children and their families:

1. They will understand and appreciate better their own baptism,
2. They will renew their lives in light of their baptismal promises,
3. The baptismal symbols of the Easter season will be more meaningful.

### An Act of Spiritual Communion
