Reflections on the Sunday Readings: Epiphany of the Lord

Infinite access to information makes it overwhelming to hear the voice of God. We are overjoyed when we think we finally have the correct message, as were the Magi when they saw the star. However, what about when we have lost that star and don't know what the right path is?

It's comical, comparing the challenges of our over abundant access to information to the Magi with only a star and a message from a dream. How do we know what is truly right—be it not enough or alternatively too much information to guide us? We look back at how early Catholics exiled or executed those who did not follow the faith in the way they interpreted it, acts that we now believe were not the message that God was trying to send. What are we doing today that future generations of Catholics will look back upon and conclude that we misinterpreted God's message?



Unlike the actions of our ancestors, what can we be doing to make everyone feel welcome to join our faith—regardless of their income level, ethnicity or membership in other populations that we have made feel unwelcome? The same star that led the Magi to their epiphany still shines today and will continue to lead us towards the faith that God has intended for all of his people.

The Visit of the Magi

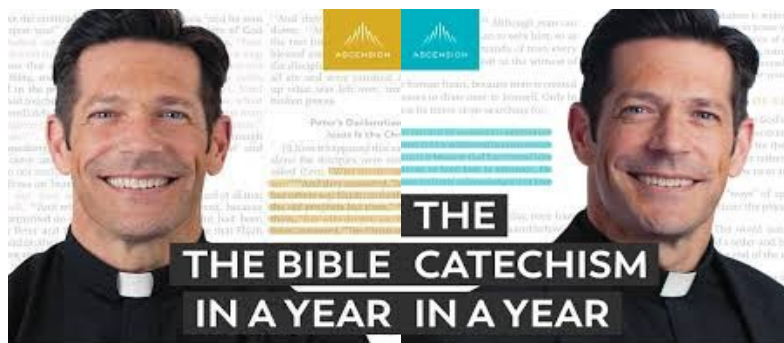
