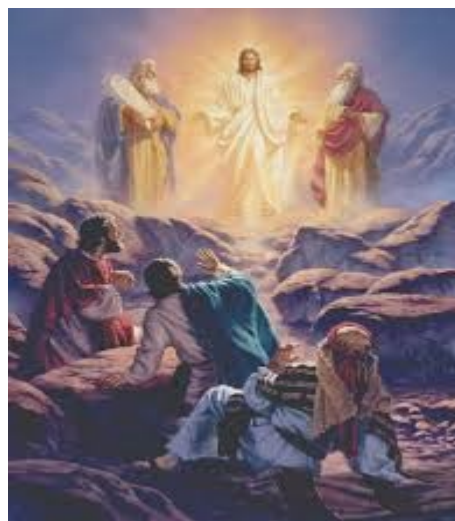
**Marriage:** Minimum **Six months** noticed required. Couples must be practising members of our Parish. Call the Parish Office to arrange a meeting with the priest.

## Reflections on the Sunday Readings:

Today's readings invite us to ponder in our hearts our experience of God's call. Many of us are given occasional mountain top experiences, which we usually do not talk about. Yet it is important to revisit often these special moments and reclaim the insights and graces received.

During the Transfiguration, Jesus hears again the call that he heard at his baptism, to trust that he is God's "beloved" one, an invitation also meant for us. We all carry one question hidden in our hearts during our whole

lives. "Am I loveable as I am?" This touches on our experience of what it means to be human, with our gifts and weaknesses. It is so easy to judge ourselves as not being "enough" in a variety of ways. What if we dared to

accept the challenge to believe that God loves us passionately, unconditionally and forever? Isn't that the deepest desire of our hearts?

Like Jesus and his disciples, we must claim and embrace our beloved-ness again and again without fear, as this choice will surely shape our happiness and priorities in life. It is in our ordinary daily life, rooted in family, work and community, that the truth of our beloved-ness will continue to grow in us. Let us today ask for this grace so that we may encourage others as well.

### A Return of The Way of the Cross Tableau



The Way of the Cross, also known as The Stations of the Cross, is a spiritual pilgrimage through contemplation of the Passion of Christ. It grew from imitations of the Via Dolorosa in Jerusalem, a traditional processional route representing the path Jesus

walked from the house of Pontius Pilate to Golgotha, the place of Christ's crucifixion. In 2022, a dedicated group of fifteen St. Charles parishioners worked for months to create a 45-minute tableau version video of the Way of the Cross. When uploaded to the St. Charles parish YouTube channel in Lent, it received over 600 views. You will be able to view it again this year from Ash Wednesday (February 22) until Easter. ## Creative Ideas for What to Give up Or Take up for Lent

### Ways to bring God more into your life this Lent:

1. Reading a chapter of the Bible each day too much? Just read a verse (only one!) from the Bible and pray about that verse for 15 minutes.
2. At the end of each day, set aside a few minutes to reflect over your day and look for the hand of God in it. Keep a list in a notebook of each of these instances.
3. Read a few pages of *The Greatest Miracle in World* by Og Mandino each day. It's only 108 pages long but it is one of the most meaningful books you will ever read.
4. Pray "Lord Jesus Christ Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner." (the Jesus prayer) every time you stop at a red light. If you don't drive, pray it every time you wash your hands.
5. Get an adult colouring book with a Christian theme. Colour one page per day (or one page every two days if it's really detailed) and spend the time while colouring in quiet contemplation.
6. Have a "mini" sacrament of reconciliation each evening before bed. Think about your day and choose one downfall to share with God, asking for His forgiveness and his help in overcoming it.
7. Visit "Sacred Space" each day and pray the daily prayer. Make it the first thing you do when you come to your computer—prior to any social media, email, or websites.
8. Love Instagram? Take part in the "InstaLent" photo challenge. It's a modern, creative way to add some spiritual reflection to your Lenten experience.
9. Each day, invite your followers on social media to submit prayer requests. Every night before bed, pray for them.
10. Sign up for "the Best Lent Ever" and watch the daily videos as they arrive in your email.
